A new school year brings new routines, new experiences, and new people who will play an important role in your child's journey. These may include your child's preschool or child care teacher, special education teacher, therapists, or others who support your child's development.

No matter the role, everyone shares the same goal: helping your child have a successful year of learning and growth. Remember that you are a key member of your child's team. Your insight plays a vital role in linking together your child's experiences at school and at home. You know your child best, and when you share what you know, you strengthen the partnership between home and school.

You don't need to wait for an Individualized Education Program (IEP) meeting to share important information. Your daily input is critical to building the right plan for your child's success. Sometimes, what you notice at home is the missing piece we need to support your child in school.

**Building confidence through** clear expectations

Children thrive when expectations are clear, simple, and positive—at school, at home, and in the community. Just like other skills, behavior must be taught! When children know what's expected and how to follow through, they feel more confident, successful, and safe.

Families can reinforce this at home by keeping expectations clear and consistent. Together, we can help children grow into confident, caring community members!
